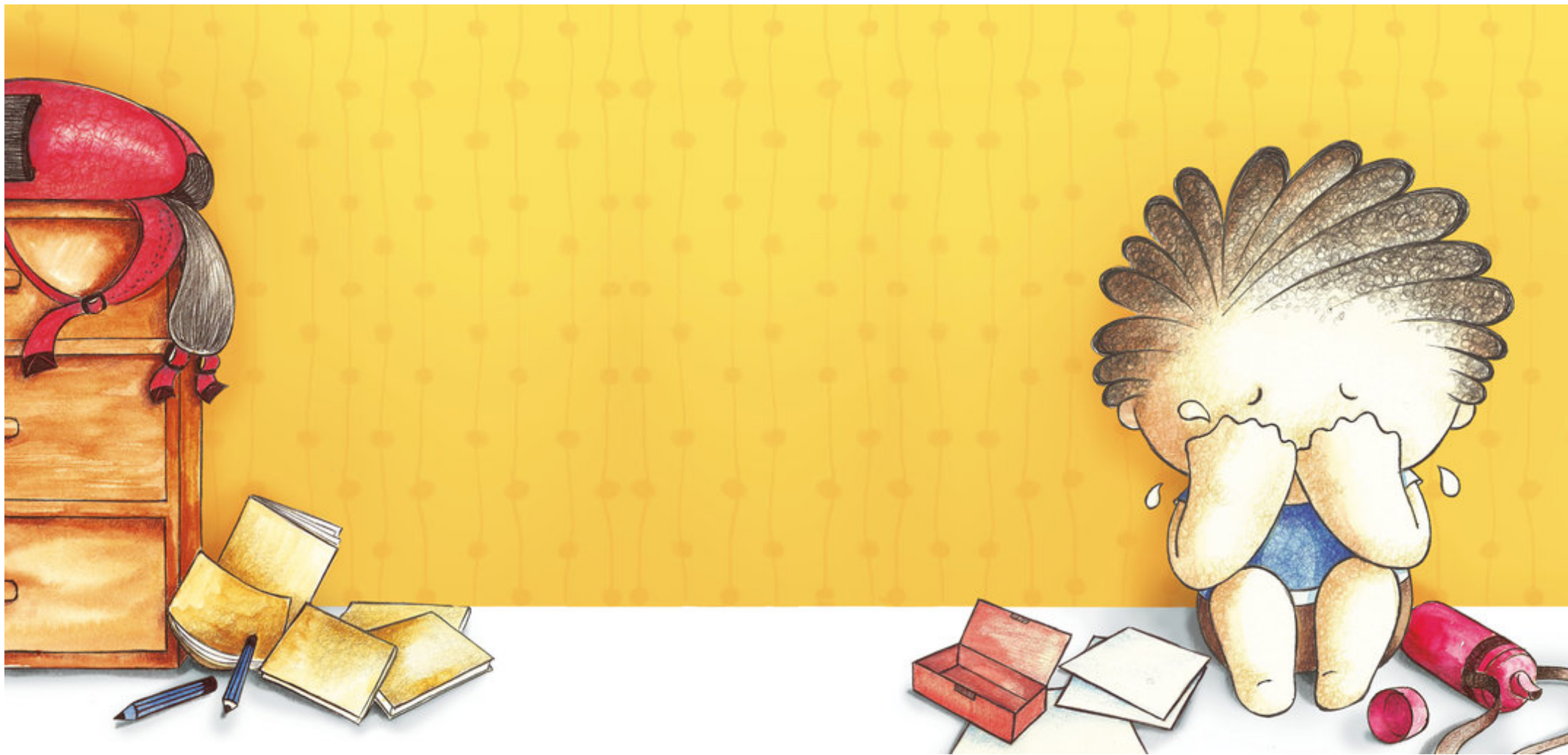
Not here, not there.

Sob, sob, where have you gone?



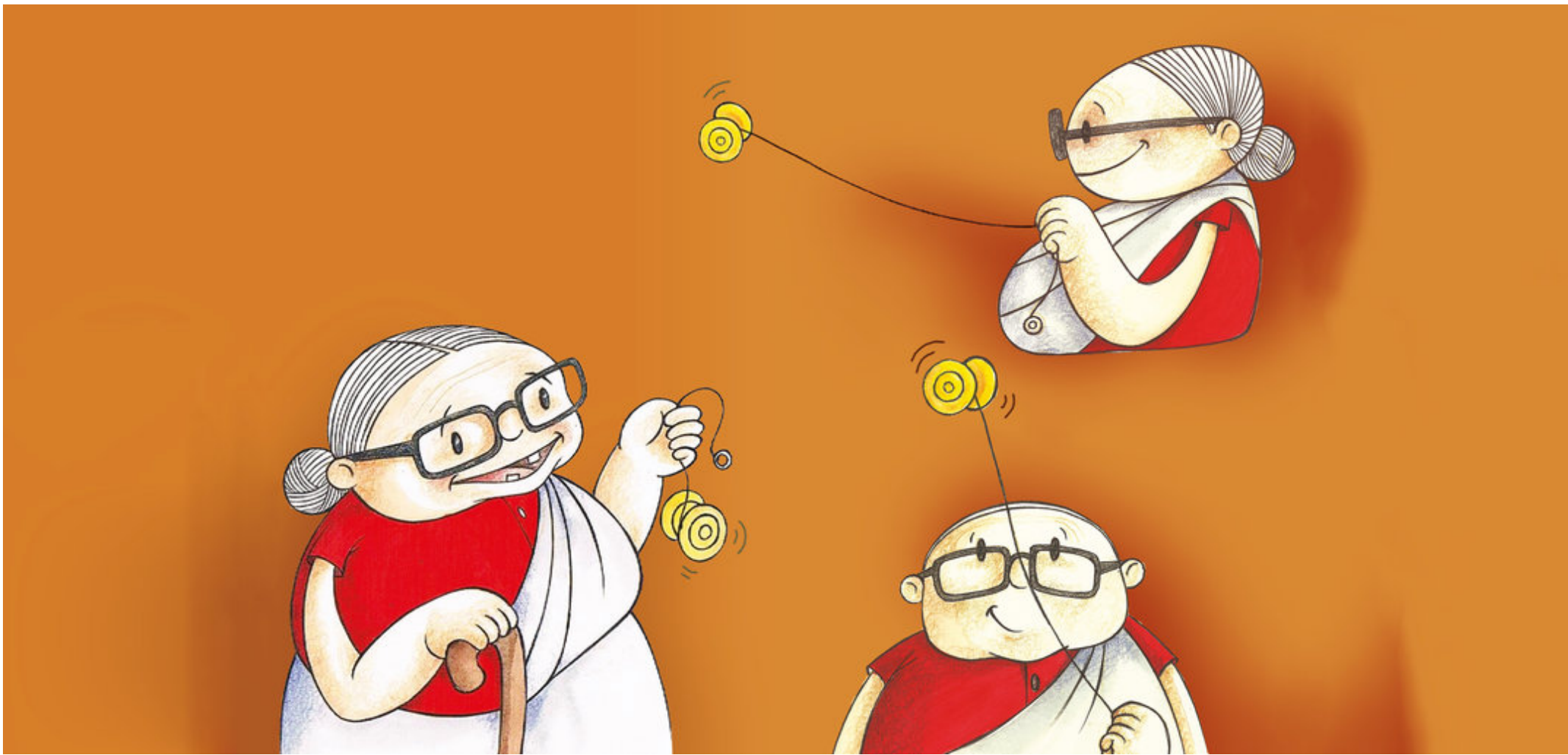
I have looked in every room,

"Look what I found in the park."



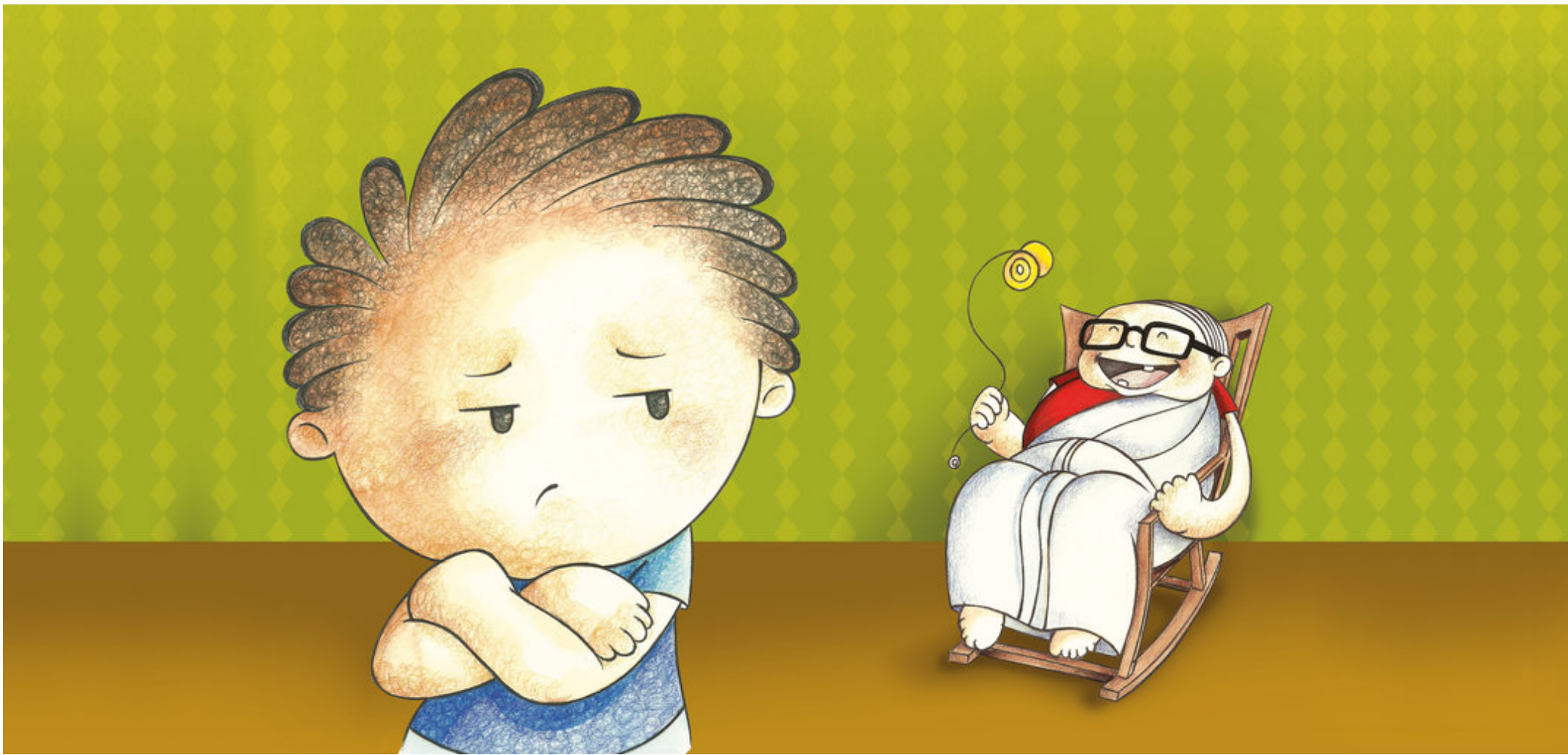
"It can sway, it can bounce.
